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Pasadena

Jean-Marie Massaud and Vondom once again combine talent and creative vision with Pasadena, a proposal that embraces the outdoors (and not only the outdoors) with a touch of serenity and well-balanced shapes. Its author, fascinated by the idea of giving a new reading to the most iconic sofas, wanted to add an almost sculptural nuance, but without renouncing the warmth that so identifies Vondom's hallmark.

'The ambition of Pasadena is to take an archetype and transform it into something of architectural proportions, but with a large dose of comfort', explains Massaud. But Pasadena goes one step further: its secret lies in the perfect balance between soft profiles, lightness of line and a comfort that can be felt even before sitting down. 'This balance is the key to timelessness,' says the designer.

The connection between Vondom and Jean-Marie Massaud is strengthened with Pasadena, a family of pieces -a bar stool, modular sofa, side table and sun lounger- that rescues that formal restraint associated with the most iconic designs, though it goes further in the search for comfort. The author describes this essence as 'sensuality and generosity in the profiles, nothing exaggerated'. This duality between refined lines and an enveloping welcome is perceived at all angles, creating an atmosphere very close to the interior, but with the resistance demanded by life outdoors.

Using Vondom's previous experience with technical materials and weatherproof foams, the study of each element has made it possible to achieve a restful atmosphere similar to that of an enclosed space, without sacrificing the freshness of the outdoors.


With this creation, Jean-Marie Massaud unfolds a serene and joyful universe, where comfort does not sacrifice aesthetics, nor does aesthetics take precedence over functionality. In the end, Pasadena captures this timeless essence: a tribute to restrained elegance, which beats with the same intensity in open spaces or in living rooms where everyday life flows. A new way of savouring the outdoors without renouncing the relaxed sophistication that Vondom knows how to imprint on each of its pieces.

Fusta

Fusta is a collection born from the desire to explore the balance between the warmth of Mid-Century style and the sobriety of Scandinavian design, resulting in a serene, refined, and essential collection.

The pieces that make up Fusta are defined by an organic and enveloping structure, sculpted from solid teak wood. Its sinuous, continuous lines flow naturally, creating a light and harmonious silhouette that interacts with its surroundings. The wood, crafted with artisanal precision, takes center stage — not only for its materiality but also for its ability to evoke tactile and visual sensations.

The project is completed with cushions designed to provide a comfortable user experience without compromising the lightness of the ensemble. Each element has been conceived to integrate seamlessly into diverse outdoor spaces while maintaining a consistent and recognizable identity.

Fusta embodies a design philosophy where form, function, and emotion coexist in perfect balance. The result is a collection that goes beyond aesthetics, embracing an approach to outdoor living based on tranquility, well-being, and a deep connection with natural materials.

With Fusta, Vondom introduces for the first time a collection made entirely of teak in collaboration with Ramón Esteve, expanding its formal universe towards a more organic and timeless sensibility—without relinquishing innovation in outdoor furniture design.

Madison

"It is the spirit of timeless, classic and ever-changing elegance that dresses for every occasion and use. The essence of a Manhattan street that still retains its energy and has been able to adapt to the passage of time to remain a reference of both architectural style and the New Yorker way of living... I wanted my Madison chair to reflect this changing spirit, Modern and Classic at the same time and to offer all the possibilities of use with its multiple finishes, noble and hospitality. A design for everyone, from New York City!". - Eugeni Quitllet

The Catalan creator has taken as his inspiration the New York atmosphere that fuses the historical and the contemporary in the same heartbeat. Madison was born under the idea of dressing a unique structure with four different personalities: one of resin slats, with a timeless character; another with a light appearance, which exudes freshness; a third one more classic and enveloping; and the last one, made with an innovative material that reminds us of the warmth of wood.

Following in the wake of an emblematic Manhattan street, Vondom's new collection dresses each occasion with its own finish - always with multiple chromatic possibilities - to adapt to both indoor and outdoor spaces.

Madison reflects that vital attitude of the big city, a place where deep-rooted traditions mingle with the modern pulse. The result is a piece that embraces comfort, but with that unmistakable Vondom touch. This reaffirms the complicity between the firm and its designer, offering a proposal that connects with any environment and which, in the words of Quitllet, "wants to reach everyone, like New York itself".



Stone introduces a series of new pieces, always true to its smooth and rounded essence. The new planters stand out for their generous and organic silhouette, inviting you to bring life to spaces with their own personality through a variety of sizes and proportions. The low stools offer a lightweight, casual, and flexible seating option, perfect for spontaneously adding extra seats to any indoor or outdoor setting. Finally, the low table brings practicality and natural elegance, serving as the ideal centerpiece for relaxed gatherings and endless conversations.

Each piece is crafted from polyethylene resin using rotational molding, a technique that ensures absolute resistance to harsh weather conditions, water, and UV rays.

This guarantees durability and maximum functionality in gardens, terraces, or contemporary interiors.

The color palette remains deeply inspired by the Mediterranean landscape, bringing visual freshness and allowing each element to blend subtly with its surroundings.

With these new additions, Giovannoni and Gargan further strengthen the subtle dialogue between design and nature that defines Stone. A collection that merges visual harmony and comfort, inviting you to experience the sensation of discovering small organic gems, ready to become part of everyday life.



Jean-Marie Massaud

Since the beginning of his career (a 1990 graduate of Paris' ENSCI-Les Ateliers, Paris Design Institute), has been working on an extensive range of works, stretching from architecture to objects, from one-off project to serial ones, from macro environment down to micro contexts.

Beyond his elegant designs, his quest for lightness –in matters of essence– synthesize three broader stakes: individual and collective fulfillment, economic and industrial efficiency, and environmental concerns. "I'm trying to find an honest, generous path with the idea that, somewhere between the hard economic data, there are users. People."

Ramón Esteve

Ramón Esteve Cambra is Architect and Designer; arising one facet as a consequence of the other. In 1991, he founded Ramón Esteve Estudio with the premise that architecture is a global discipline.

His training as an architect became a transversal vision where Architecture and Design form one single concept, almost inseparable, both generated under the same laws and the same design premises. Its aim is the development of complete environments through a mutual interaction between both disciplines, so design acts on architecture and vice versa and the importance and difficulty of both disciplines are equally acknowledged.

Eugeni Quitllet


The Catalan designer Eugeni Quitllet was born on 17th April 1972 in Ibiza. He graduated from 'La Llotja' art school in Barcelona. Through his creative vocabulary he exceeds simple relationships between function and style unveiling innovative objects.

Between drawing, sculpture and contemporary archaeology, Quitllet literally reveals silhouettes hidden in the material, extremely visual skeletal objects elegantly master fullness and emptiness often with a touch of humour: the Masters chair combines the 3 contours of legendary seats by Eames, Saarineen and Jacobsen, the K Ray lamp is an organic UFO, a network of veins hol – lowed out of the material which results in an object suspended in a frame, his signature method prevalent naturally in several of the designer's projects: the Shine vases, the Light Air lamp, the O'Clock lamp, without forgetting the O Ring watch, a hole in time in the true sense, best seller of the brand Fossil modernising watchmaking codes.

Eugeni Quitllet is a design world freak capable of devouring the whole of our environment in his own way to serve it up to us transformed.




Stefano Giovannoni + Elisa Gargan
